# End of Canal Security

You may recall that last year we carried out a Security Survey of all residents living on the ends of the canals and presented the results to the Redeliffe City Council in October of that year.

The survey was carried out as a result of security concerns, particularly out of hours raised by members at the Annual General Meeting.

As a result of this action Council have now installed new signs at the ends of all canals which read:

Redeliffe City Council Local Law Notice The Digging For Worms And Yabbies In The Canal Prohibited

Residential Area Access To The Canals Including Netting/Sourcing Of Bait During Daylight Hours Only

The effectiveness of the new signs will be tested with time, however some early feedback from a resident on the end of one canal has indicated that they are working in restraining non resident canal access out of daylight hours which was a primary security concern.

We have expressed on your behalf our thanks to council for the action taken.
